## Registration Deadline is September 25, 2020

As always, the safety of our Scouts, volunteers, employees and communities is top priority. If you have a fever, cough, or other symptoms associated with COVID-19 or it is believed you may have been exposed to COVID-19, you should isolate and not attend this Scouting event. If this camporee is cancelled or postponed due to an extreme weather event we will attempt to get the information out to participants by phone, e-mail, posting a notice on our social media page and our website. In the event this camporee is postponed, your registration will be transferred to the new date. If you are unable to attend the rescheduled event, you may request a refund in writing to the De Soto Area Council according to our standard policy. If the event is cancelled outright a full refund will be processed and issued.

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- Participants will need to complete the CDC health screening form prior to arrival of the event and turn in at registration. The health screening form will be reviewed and thermal temperature scans will be done. This process will be repeated Saturday morning before breakfast. If a participant has a fever or any signs and symptoms of COVID-19 they will be quarantined in a designated area of the camping area away from other participants until a parent can pick them up. If the participant is an adult over 18 they will be asked to leave the event.
- Participants will not be permitted to sleep in a tent with another person unless it is a sibling within 2 years of age.
- Participants are advised not to share camp chairs or any other miscellaneous camping items with other individuals unless they are properly washed or disinfected. When seated, participants must social distance at least 6ft. in between each other and wear face coverings.
- Participants are encouraged to bring their own hand sanitizer, individual snacks, water bottle or Nalgene, and facial mask or covering.
- DAC will provide the following food preparations: Pre-packaged individual snacks at Cracker Barrel for Friday night campfire. Breakfast and lunch will be individually wrapped and placed in a brown paper bag. Individual juices and bottled water will be served.
- Participants will be required to maintain 6ft. social distancing for restroom and water breaks. Frequent handwashing with soap and water for at least 20 seconds will be encouraged before eating food, after using the toilet, after blowing your nose, coughing or sneezing, after putting, touching, or removing cloth face mask or coverings. Avoid touching your face, mouth, nose or eyes.
- Participants will maintain at least 6ft. social distancing while participating in the service project for the state park. Masks or facial coverings must be worn when unable to keep a distance of 12ft.
